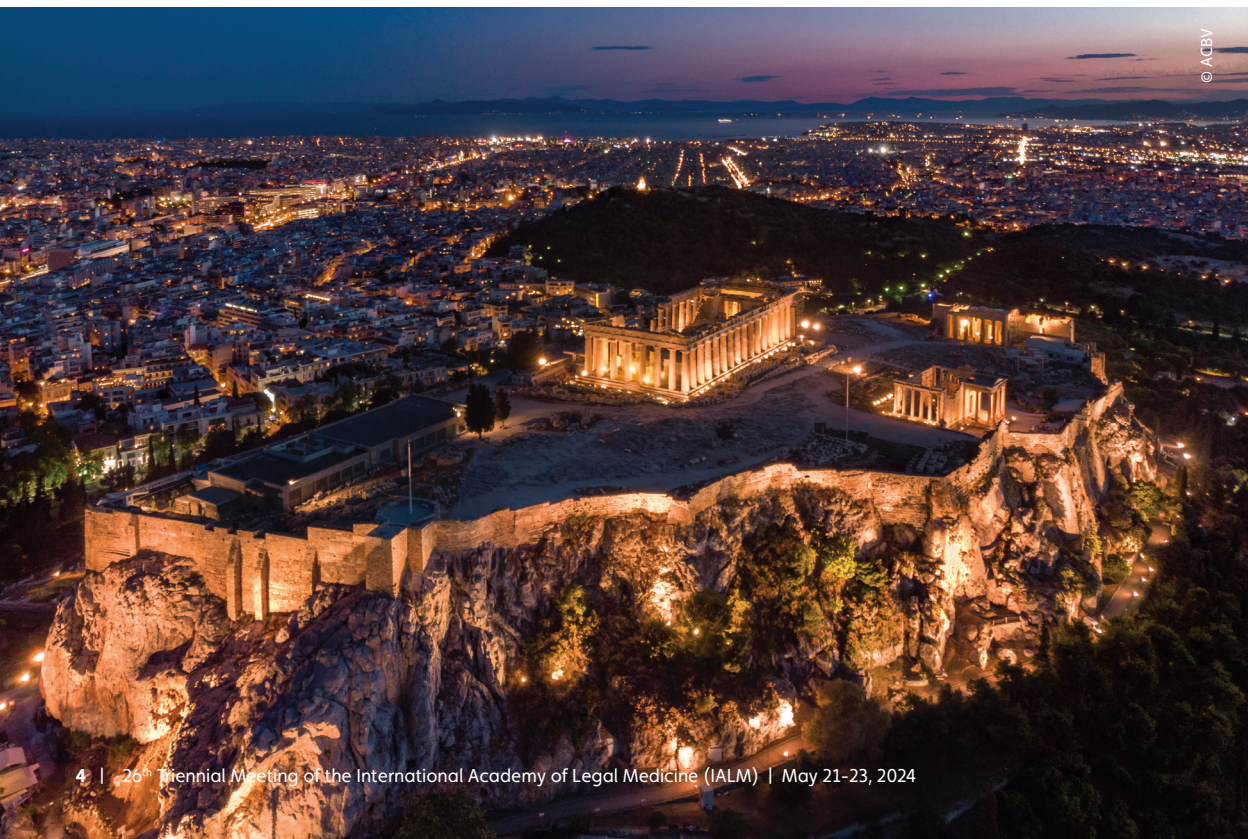


## About Athens

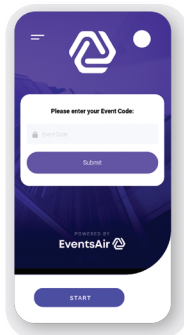

The weather in Athens in May is warm, with an average high of 25°C (77°F). The usual daytime temperature is 22°C (71.6°F) and at night, this may fall to a low of just 16°C (60.8°F) on cooler days. You can expect to see a lot of sunshine during the month, with nine hours on average each day from 14 hours of daylight.

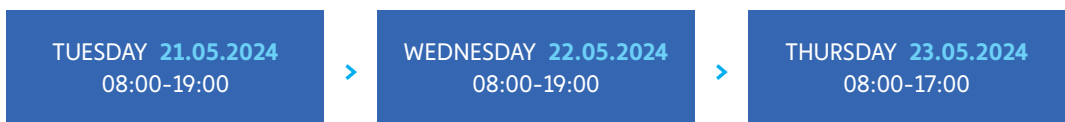
All Meeting session halls are equipped with the following:

The Speakers' Preview Desk will be operating throughout Meeting dates, according to the below schedule:



Chairs, Speakers and Oral Communication presenters should be close to the stage and ready for the session at least 15 minutes before its beginning, to meet the steward/hostess and ensure everything is in place. 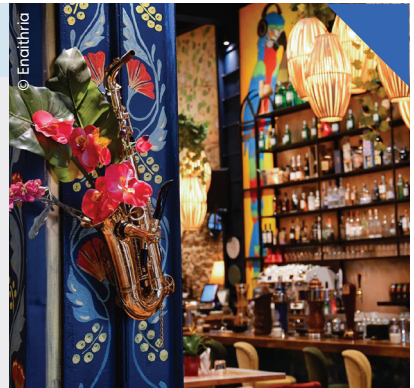

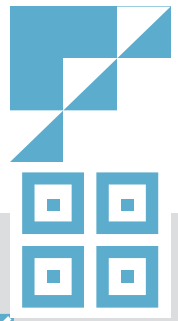

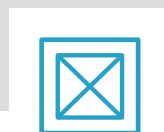
